OVERVIEW: The applications developer is responsible for software development, testing, and systems administration. Duties include, but are not limited to: writing local programs for both client/server applications and web applications using 3GL and 4GL programming languages; testing and documenting results for proposed software integrations; providing proper handoff on court developed applications to “day-to-day” IT staff; planning, testing and installing revised releases of national systems; managing upgrades, back-ups, and changes for PC-based projects; assisting in the implementation of emergency preparedness plan; serving as technical expert in testing, diagnosing and solving computer systems problems; and assisting with programming and updating changes to the external and internal web sites. The applications developer reports to the research and development manager.

EXPERIENCE REQUIRED: To qualify for this position, the applicant must have:

A) At least two years of progressively responsible and specialized experience in software application design, development, testing, troubleshooting, deployment, and system integration and administration. One of the two years required must be at or equivalent to the Federal Government grade level of either GS11 or CL27.

OR

B) Completion of a master’s degree or two years of graduate study in an accredited university in computer science and engineering (CSE) or other closely related field.

* Applicants must also have good knowledge of 3GL and 4GL standard languages, the ability to work independently and think creatively, communicate effectively both orally and in writing with a diverse audience, and be detail-oriented. A bachelor’s degree in a computer science related field, experience with Sharepoint administration and development, relational databases, .NET development, C#, ActionScript, Coldfusion, Java, and/or previous experience in a federal court using CM/ECF is preferred, but it is not required.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT: The position of applications developer is classified as “high sensitive.” Employment will be considered provisional pending the successful completion of an initial 10-year background investigation with updates performed every five years thereafter. Continued employment will depend upon the successful completion and favorable determinations based on these investigation results. Applicants must be US citizens or be eligible to work in the United States. Employees of the Federal Judiciary are hired as “excepted service” appointments.
