ACCOMMODATIONS

The elegant Somerset Inn, our host hotel, is located in the heart of Troy's business and financial district in close proximity to The Palace at Auburn Hills, Ford Field, Comerica Park, a golf course, and several museums and theaters. CANCELLATION POLICY

All fees, except a \$75 handling fee, will be refunded if written notice of cancellation is received by **October 21, 2014**. After October 21, upon written request, a coupon for 20% off the registration fee (not including optional events) will be issued, which can be used (by the canceling registrant only) for any ABI educational program up to one year after this conference, or for this same conference next year.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT
