ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
REGARDING CLOSING THE COURT
ON FRIDAY, JUNE 11, 2004

NO. 04-03

On Saturday, June 5, 2004, former President Ronald Reagan passed away. President Bush has declared Friday, June 11, 2004, a National Day of Mourning to honor the memory of the former president. The President's Executive Order declares that on June 11, 2004, federal offices will be closed and the day will be treated as a holiday for federal leave purposes.

F.R. Bank. P. 9006(a) allows for the extension of time to file a pleading or paper when the last day of a designated period of time to file a pleading or other paper falls on a legal holiday. The rule further states that a "legal holiday" includes a day appointed as a holiday by the President. Since the President has declared that on June 11, 2004, federal offices will be closed and the day is a holiday for federal leave purposes, the time to file a pleading or paper should be extended. NOW THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED that in the event June 11, 2004, will be the last day of a designated period to file a pleading or other paper, the time to timely file such pleading or paper is extended to June 14, 2004, in accordance with Bankruptcy Rule 9006(a).
