(iii) requires a person who is not a party or an officer of a party to incur substantial
expense to travel more than 100 utiles to attend trial, the court may, to protect a person subject

to or affected by the subpoens, quash or modify the subpoens or, if the party in whose behalf the subpoens is issued shows a substantial need for the testimony or material that cannot be otherwise met without made hardship and assures that the person to whom the subpoens is addressed will be reasonably compensated, the court may order appearance or production only upon specified conditions.

(d) DUTIES IN RESPONDING TO SUPPOENA.

(1) (A) A person responding to a subpoena to produce documents shall produce them as they are kept in the usual course of business or shall organize and label them to correspond will the categories in the demand.

(B) If a subpoena does not specify the form or forms for producing electronically stored information, a person responding to a subpoena must produce the information in a form or forms in which the person ordinarily, maintains if or in a form or forms that are reasonably usable.

(C) A person responding to a subpoena need not provide discovery of electronically stored information in more than one form.

(D) A person responding to a subpoena need not provide discovery of electronically stored information from sources that the person identifies as not reasonably accessible because of undue burden or cost. On motion to compet discovery or to quash, the person from whom discovery is sought must show that the information sought is not reasonably accessible because of undue burden or cost. If that showing is made, the cottin may nonefieless order discovery from such sources if the requesting party shows good cause, considering the limitations of Rule 26(b)2/(C).
