AMENDED NOTICE OF EXPIRATION OF THE CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY (CARES) ACT

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was signed into law on March 27, 2020 and included certain temporary amendments to the Bankruptcy Code. See CARES Act, Div. A, Title I § 1113. The COVID-19 Bankruptcy Relief Extension Act of 2021 was signed into law in March 2021 and extended the CARES Act's bankruptcy-related amendments for an additional year.

The CARES Act expired on March 27, 2022, including the bankruptcy-related amendments.

As a result of the expiration of the CARES Act, Official Forms 101, 122A-1, 122B-1, 122C-1, and 201 have reverted back to the pre-CARES Act versions. The forms can be found here. Subsequent to the posting of the April 1, 2022, Notice of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, the Administrative Office of the United States Courts advised that the COVID-19 Bankruptcy Relief Extension Act of 2021, which extended certain deadlines under Section 1113 of the CARES Act to March 27, 2022, does not apply to Sections 4022 and 4023 of the CARES Act. Therefore, the Notice of Mortgage Forbearance event will be available in the Case Management/Electronic Case Filing (CM/ECF) system.
