NOTICE REGARDING IMPLEMENTATION OF DEBTOR ELECTRONIC BANKRUPTCY NOTICING (DeBN)

Beginning on Tuesday, January 21, 2020, debtors may request receipt of court notices and certain court orders by email rather than by U.S. Mail. Through a program called Debtor Electronic Bankruptcy Noticing, or "DeBN," electronic copies of court notices and certain court orders may be sent to a debtor's email address through the Bankruptcy Noticing Center. Only notices and orders that have been issued by the court can be emailed to debtors. All other parties, such as creditors and trustees, will continue to serve the debtor via U.S. Mail, or as directed by court rules.

To participate in the DeBN program, debtors must file the Debtor's Electronic Bankruptcy Noticing Request (DeBN) form with the court. This form can be found on the court's web site. Attorneys may file a DeBN request form for debtors through the ECF system. Debtors who are not represented by an attorney may file the form with the intake department at the clerk's office. In a joint case, if both debtors wish to request enrollment in DeBN, each debtor must file a separate request form.
